Changes to end of year reporting arrangements

We are writing to inform you about changes we have made to our end of year reporting arrangements. It is a statutory requirement that schools must prepare annual reports for every pupil's parents/carers. The report must cover the pupil's: achievements, general progress and attendance record. Our end of year school reports fulfil this requirement as they will include:

- highlights personal to your child for the academic year
- a general comment about your child's attainment and progress
- child's attendance record for the academic year

To accompany this written report, a summary of your child's attainment in each National Curriculum subject will also be included for information (Early Years Foundation Stage Profile for children in Reception). In addition, statutory assessment results and information will be provided for children in the relevant year groups (eg. Phonics Screening Check - Year 1; Multiplication Tables Check -Year 4; Statutory Assessments at the end of Year 6).

In addition to the written report, we are also offering a face-to-face parent consultation at the end of the summer term. This meeting will be an opportunity for you to discuss your child's successes and achievements for the academic year as well as their developmental targets. It is our intention that the annual reports will be given to parents/carers at this meeting. If you do not wish to attend a meeting, your child's report will be delivered to you either in person or via post.
